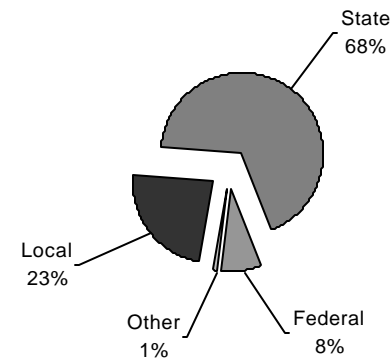


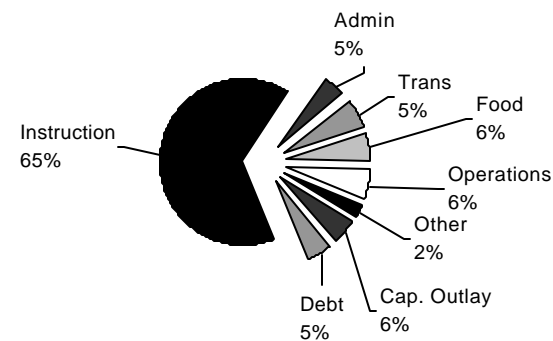
Taxpayers' Report

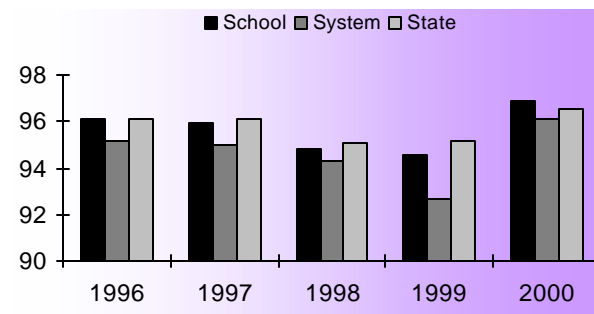

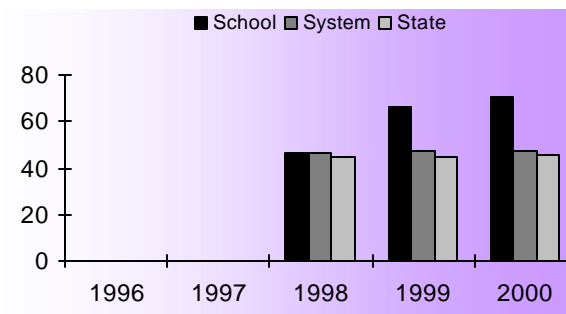
