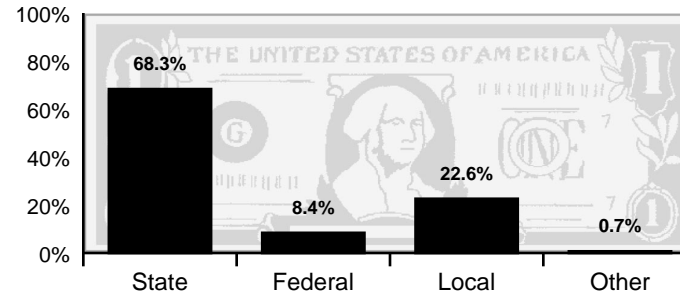

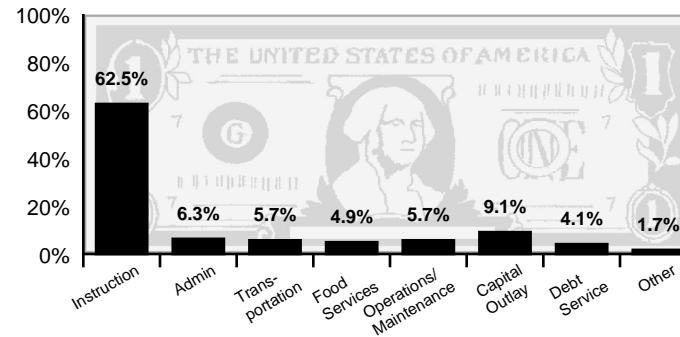

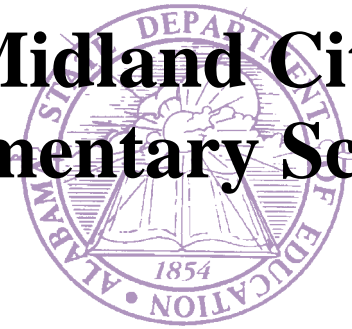
Mills Equivalent

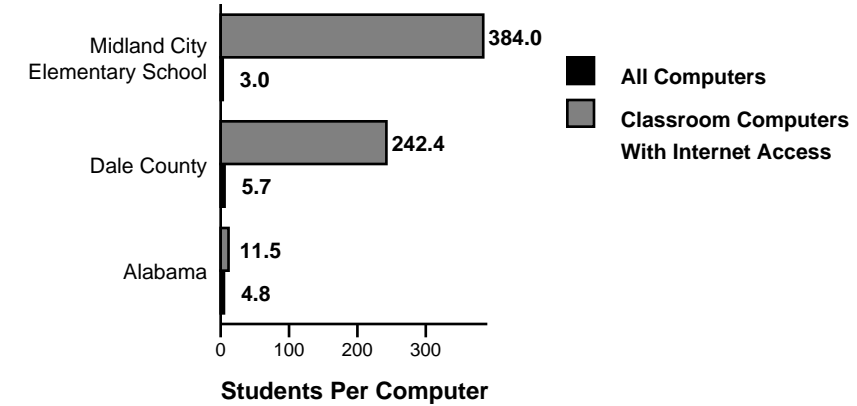

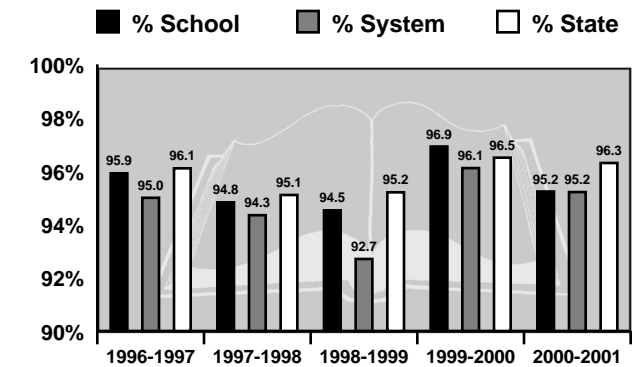

Internet access and computer use in public schools.



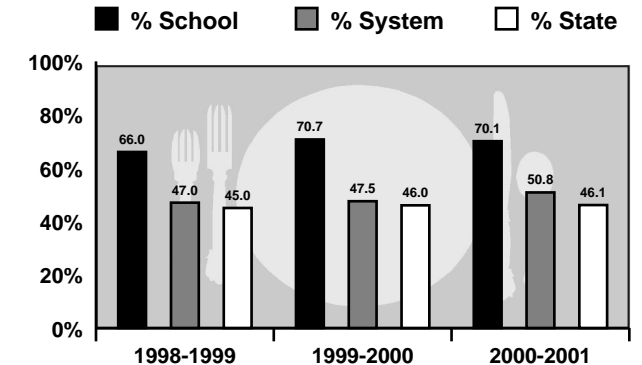
Average Daily Attendance
