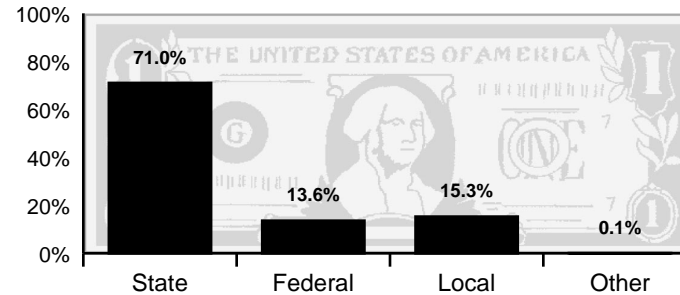

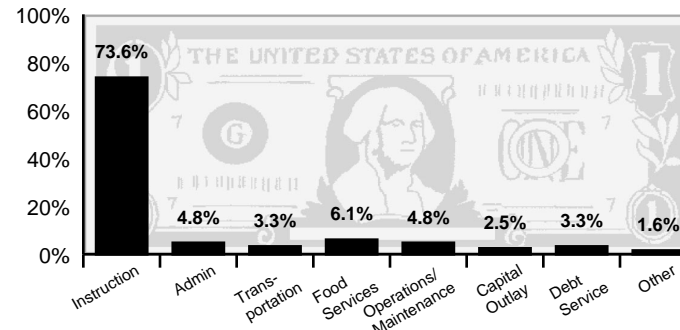

Mills Equivalent

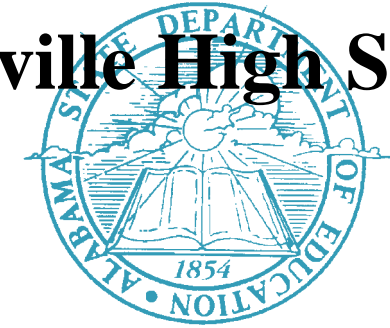

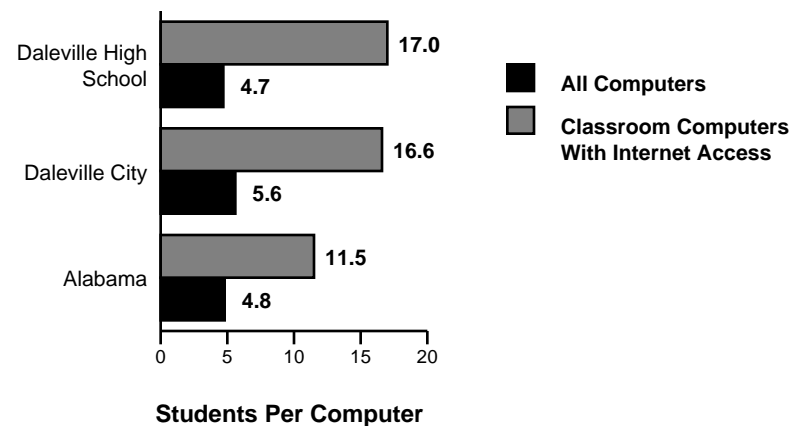
Graduation Exam

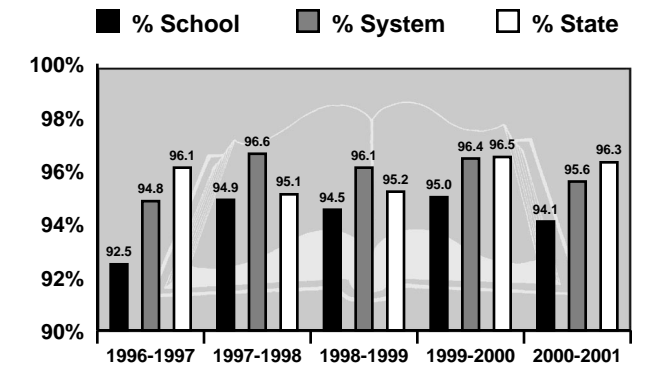
Average Daily Membership
