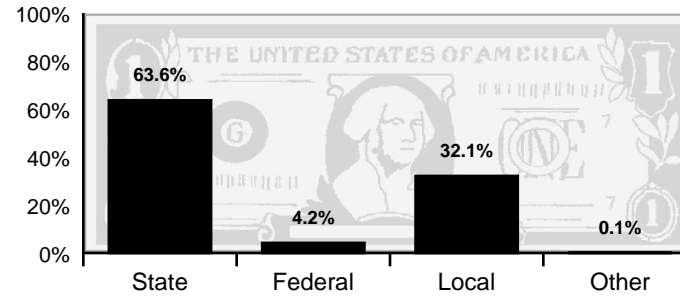

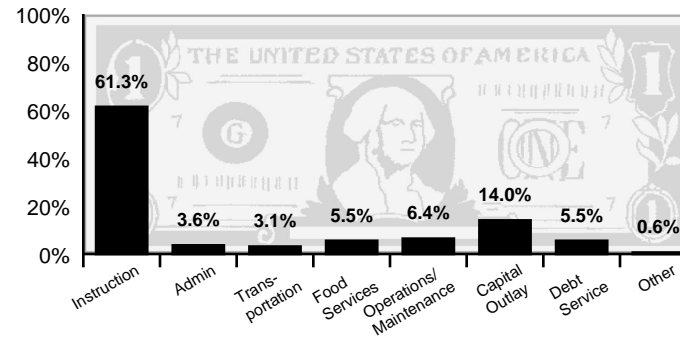
## Taxpayers' Report

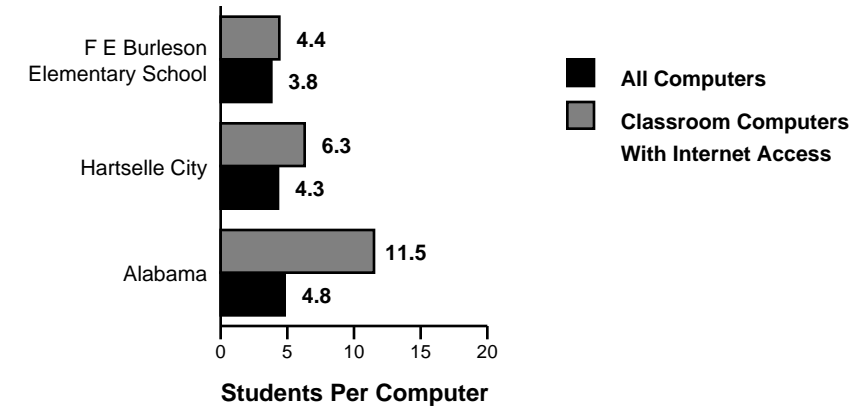

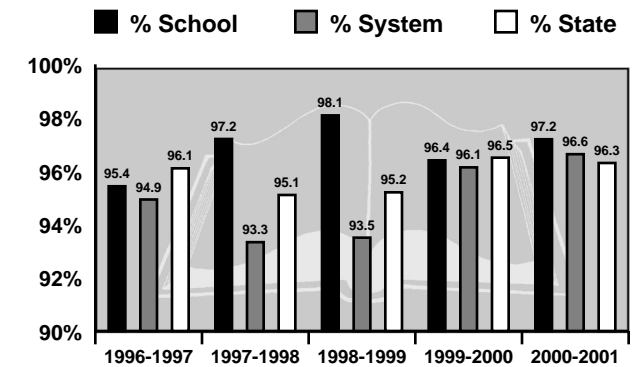

Internet access and computer use in public schools.



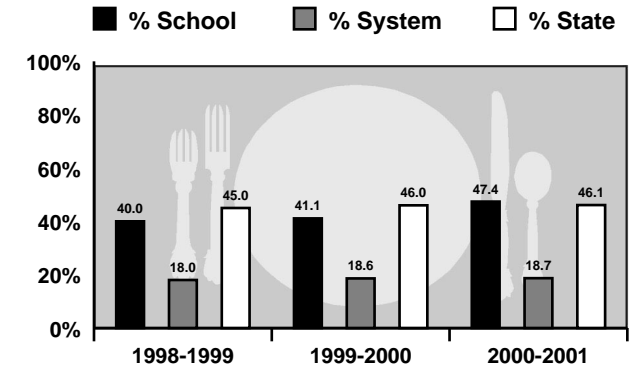
### Average Daily Attendance
