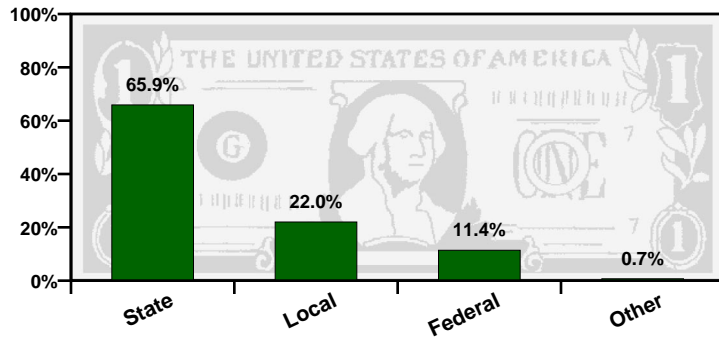

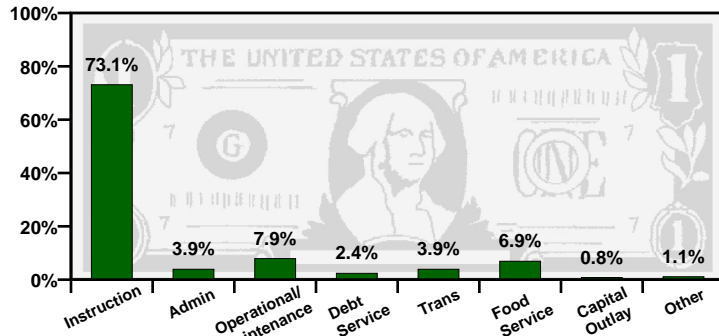

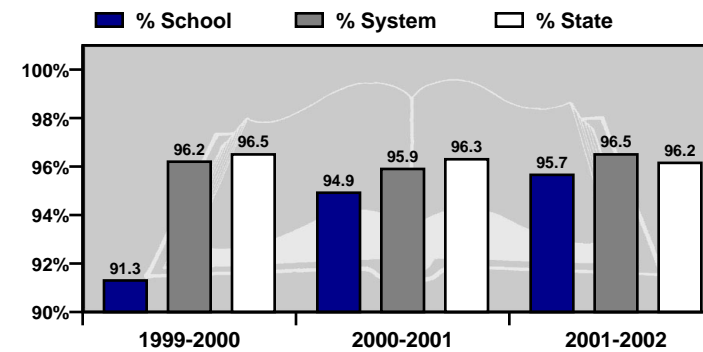
## Average Daily Membership

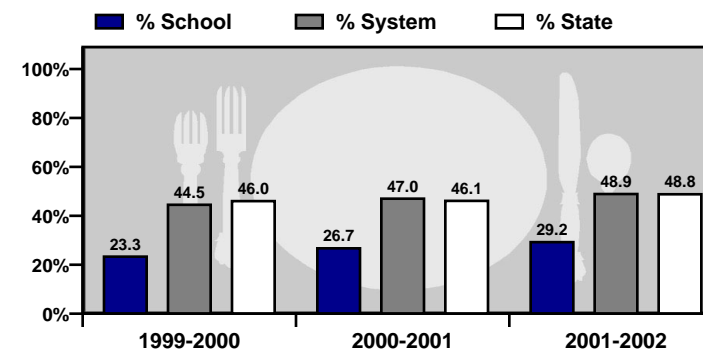
## Average Daily Attendance

This is the percent of students that attend school each day.



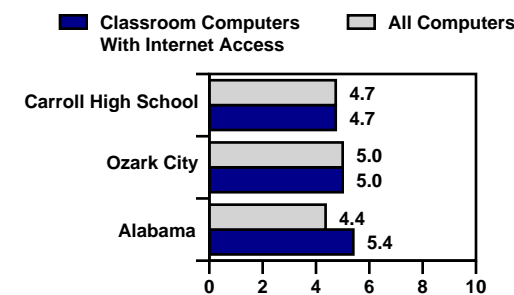
## Students Eligible for Free or Reduced Price Meals

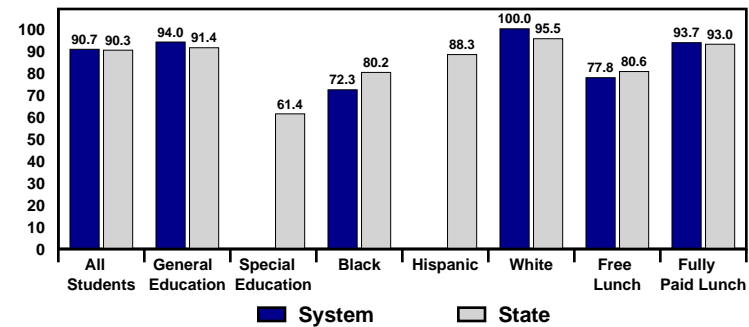
