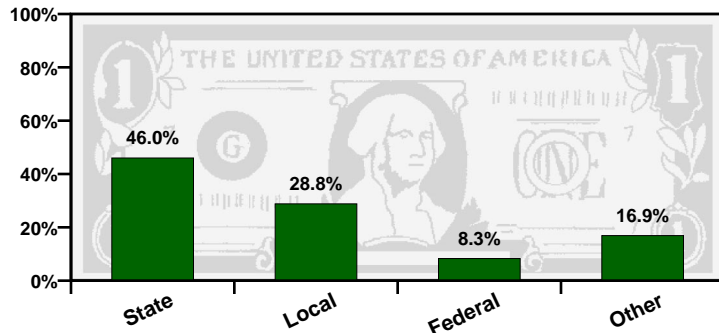

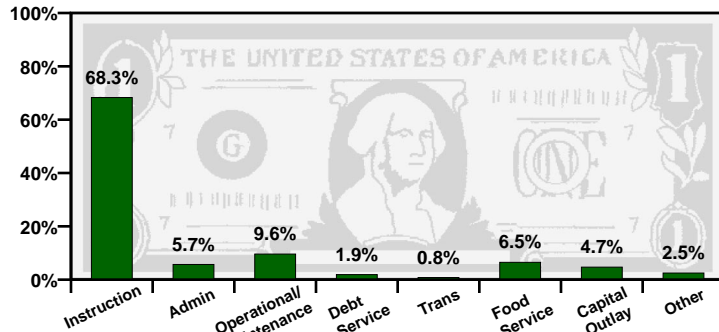

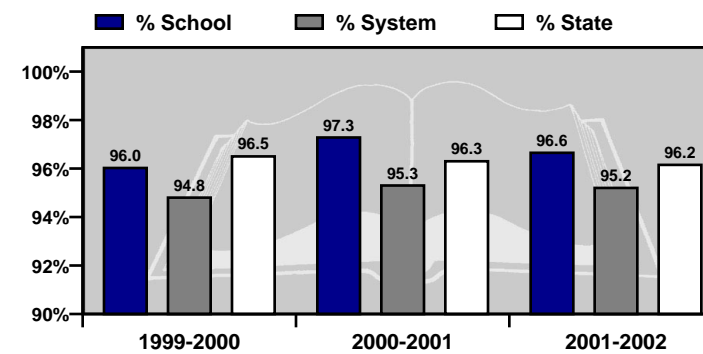
Average Daily Membership

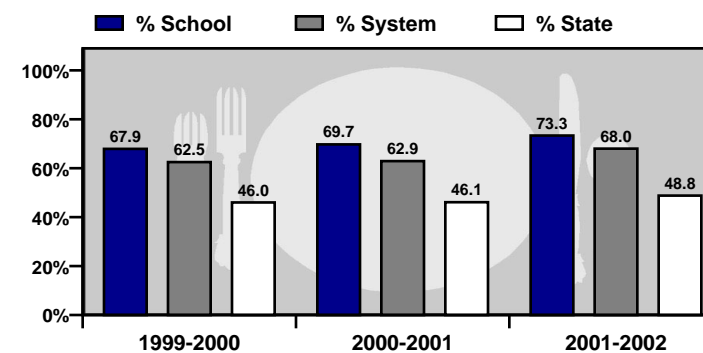
Average Daily Attendance

This is the percent of students that attend school each day.



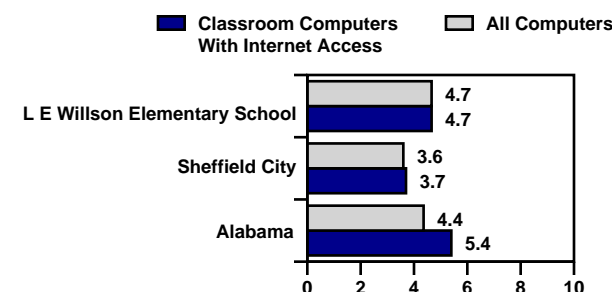
Students Eligible for Free or Reduced Price Meals

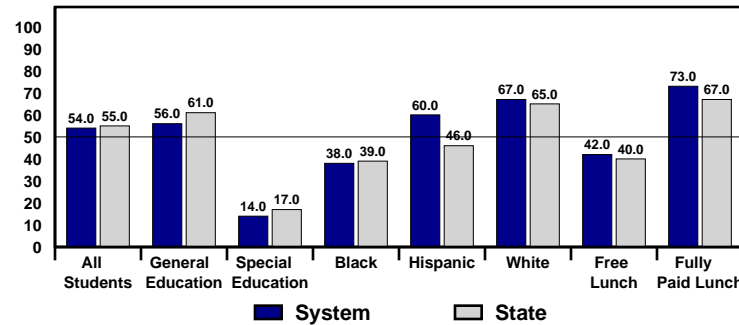
Stanford Achievement Test 2002

Stanford Achievement Test: Grades 3-8—Average Percentile Across Grades and Subjects

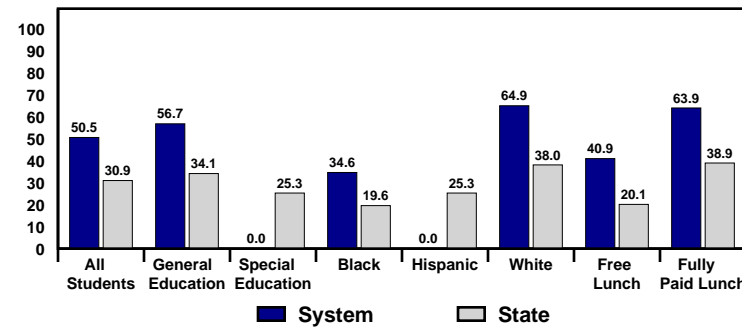


Alabama Direct Assessment of Writing 2002

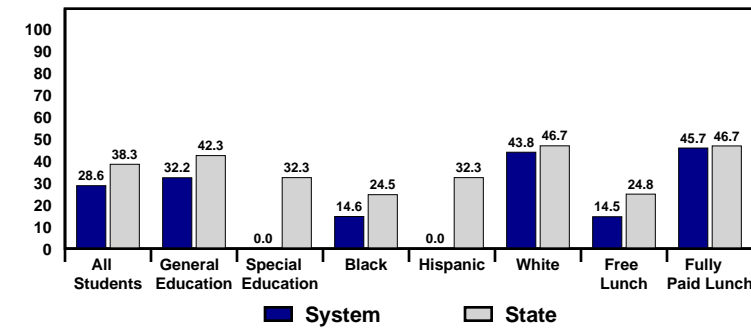

Percent of Students Meeting or Exceeding Standards



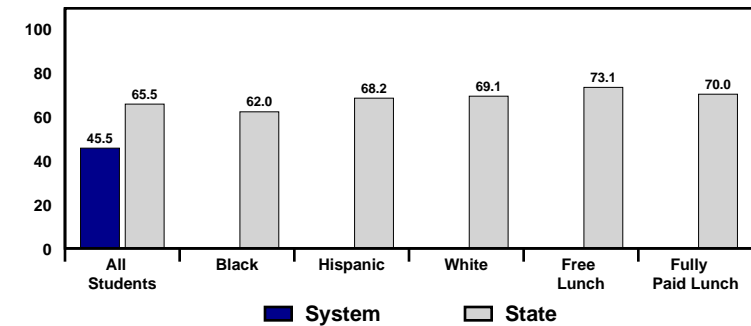
Alabama Direct Assessment of Writing: Grade Seven
