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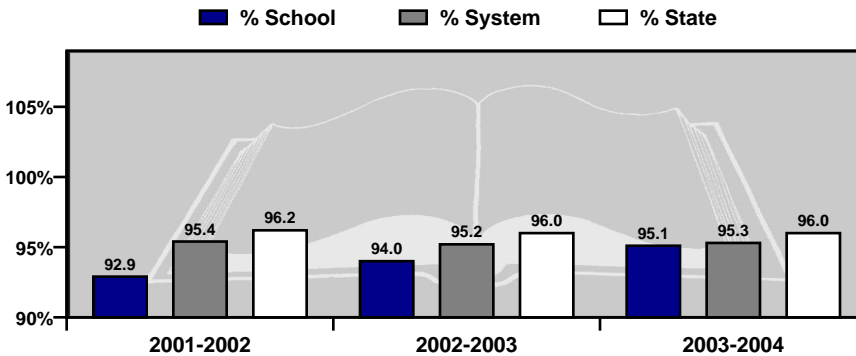

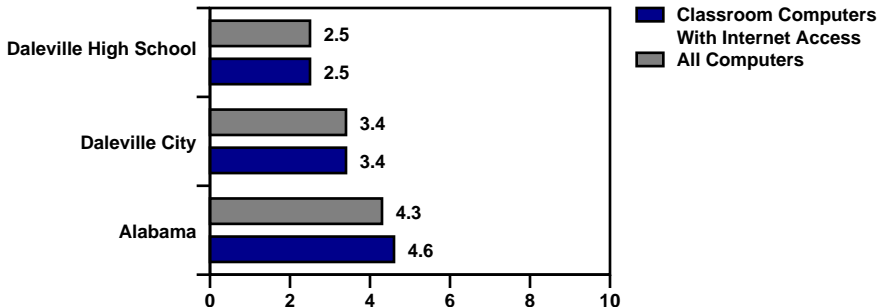
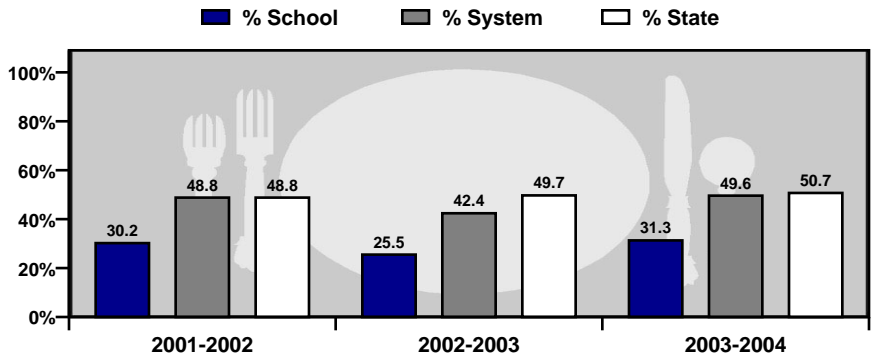


## Average Daily Attendance

## ACT Test 2004

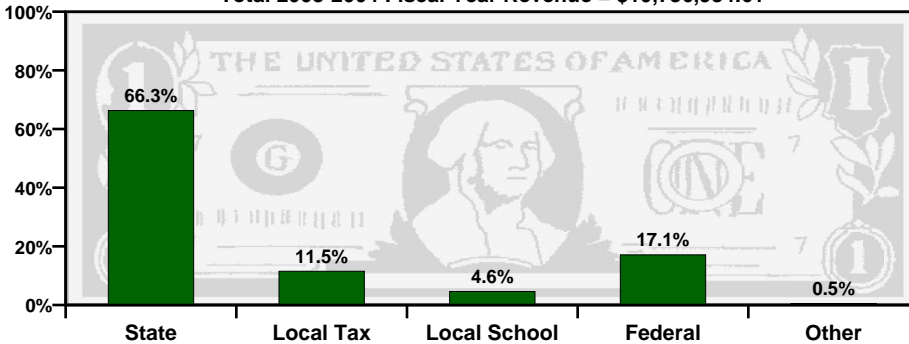

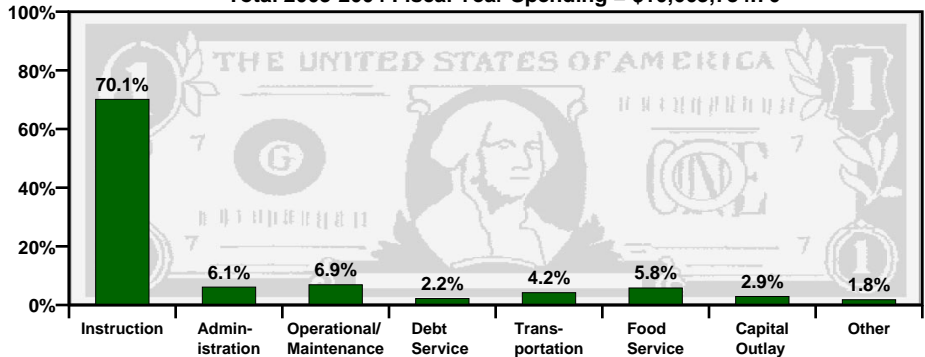
Total 2003-2004 Fiscal Year Revenue = \$10,736,934.61
